A MESSAGE FROM THE TAUPE ROOM






The new year is off to a great start in the taupe room. When we returned from winter break I was amazed at how smoothly everyone got back to the routine. There were many new works to greet them. On the cultural shelves there are a variety of works to explore from magnets to playing a melody harp. (Cultural is the umbrella term in Montessori for History, Biology, Physical science as well as the Arts).

We are using a variety of building blocks from Legos to Lincoln Logs or magnetic tiles to introduce some STEM activities. Blocks help children develop skills in all of the STEM disciplines (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math). Blocks have been a favorite activity for children since time began for a reason! If you don't have any type of blocks at home I encourage you to provide them for your child (children).

In December we were exploring animals of North America and we are now digging a little deeper into a study of the five classes of vertebrates. Soon we will begin our continent focus for this year which is North America. What vertebrates can be found in North

Much progress is being made by all the children in so many areas. I am pleased to see how comfortable they are with our daily routines and
